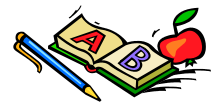


Wear Yellow for the Hospice

The N4 children have been taking part in regular visits to the Primary One classroom and all seem to be taking things in their stride.



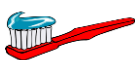
